- Founded and serve as Artistic Director of The Orchard Project, an organization that develops and supports new work. Since its first summer as a two-week pilot, the Orchard Project has supported more than 1,500 artists and more than 400 different artistic projects. With programs in New York City, Saratoga Springs, NY, and online, it hosts about 40 projects each year in multiple verticals (performance, TV, and audio). In addition to its development work, ongoing activities of The Orchard Project include hosting events for artists nationwide (through the OP's "Open Process" program), a competitive professional development program for college and graduate theater students (the OP's educational Core Company); producing productions and large-scale events in NYC; and a summer season of new work showcases (Orchard Project Summer Festival).
- Curate seasons through a competitive application process and leveraging deep industry relationships with theatres, producers, directors, agents, and ensemble companies, as well as playwrights, actors, and designers in the U.S. and abroad. To date, the Orchard Project-supported theatrical works have been produced by the Royal Court, the Public Theater, Pig Iron, Fiasco, the Rude Mechs, the TEAM, Elevator Repair Service, Tectonic Theatre Project, and more. Our artists have included leaders and innovative voices including Robert Schenkkan, Young Jean Lee, Savion Glover, Moises Kaufman, Qui Nguyen, Stew, Theresa Rebeck, Rachel Chavkin, Dave Malloy, Nathan Tysen, Annie Baker, Marcus Gardley, Mike Bartlett, Adam Rapp, and Branden Jacobs-Jenkins. Productions the Orchard Project has supported and initiated include Vampire Song (Geffen, OSF), Banghin' It (La Jolla Playhouse), A Play for the Living At a Time of Extinction (Baltimore Center Stage, Barbican Theatre, UK), Penelope (Hudson Valley Shakespeare Festival), Female Troubles (upcoming), The Shipment (The Kitchen, international tour), 33 Variations (Arena Stage, Broadway), Row (Williamstown), Gary (Broadway), Amelie: The Musical (Berkeley Rep, CTG, Broadway), Charm (Northlight Theatre, MCC Theatre), The Iphigenia Quartet (Gate Theater, London), The Aliens (Rattlestick, OBIE Award), An Octoroon (Soho Rep, National Theatre UK, OBIE Award), All the Way (OSF, ART, Broadway, HBO Films, TONY Award), The Object Lesson (BAM Next Wave, International Tour), and I Promised Myself to Live Faster (Humana Festival).
- Expanded the footprint of The Orchard Project to additional dramatic forms, including TV, audio, and digital media. Digital performance projects created by The Orchard Project include plays and interactive events, such as *Conjurors Club*, which was later produced by American Repertory Theatre. The Orchard Project's Episodic Lab and Audio Lab have opened extensive relationships in TV and audio industries, including key partnerships with Sony TriStar and Audible. These labs, founded in 2018 and 2020, respectively, have already supported over 100 writers and projects, with projects optioned and sold to producers including Audible Originals and Amazon Prime.
- **Manage business and artistic development.** This includes artistic management, fiscal management, moves management, board management, cultivating new donors and board members, creating successful fundraising events, developing new earned income opportunities, and developing grant proposals.
- Lead the Orchard Project's DEIA work, working with industry leaders Kaleel Jamison Consulting Group to expand access to our programs, create a culture of inclusion, and foster a community vocabulary that is both welcoming and also encourages artistic risk taking. The Orchard Project's DEIA commitment is manifested in its new Leadership, Inclusion and Growth Lab, produced with the support of the Nathan Cummings Foundation, for Producers and Artistic Directors nationwide, which will share case studies in inclusive growth and workshops led by KJCG.
